The lifeblood of our school community are dedicated teachers who provide students with impulses and help in their quest to find themselves and a meaning for their lives. Our teachers support the evolution of our students' personalities with their sensitivity and by providing a role model.

Our students endeavour as hard as they can to perform well at school and to be actively involved within the school community. Thus they gain self-confidence and this will enable them to take responsibility for themselves, their fellow human beings, in church and in society.

Parents identify themselves with the character of our school, contribute to its educational goals and support school life – as far as possible – in material and non-material ways.

The Head provides students with the necessary freedom to develop.
